<p>First Day Approximate times: Arrival 1300</p> <p>1930-2130</p>	<p>Arrival at the hotel. YCN guide will meet you. A get to know your guide session, a brief talk about the itinerary discuss any changes and opportunities due to weather, birds etc. with Coffee and biscuits. This is followed by the first excursion to Top Hill Low Nature Reserve approx. 20 mins drive away. Top Hill Low is a great place for wildfowl with many bird hides</p> <p>Evening meal approximately 6.30pm</p> <p>Evening talk by YCN. On the birdlife of the Yorkshire Coast, Wolds and North York Moors National Park</p>
<p>Second Day 0830 – 1700</p> <p>1230-1300</p>	<p>Full day birding tour, see destinations below for places we can visit and potential species. Sites will be chosen based on weather; birds present the day before and clients preferences.</p> <p>Evening meal approximately 6.30pm</p> <p>Approximate lunch break time each day; a packed lunch and drink will be provided. There will also be opportunities for café and toilet stops during the day as required.</p>
<p>Third Day 0830 – 1700</p>	<p>Full day birding tour, see destinations below for places we can visit and potential species. Sites will be chosen based on weather; birds present the day before and clients preferences.</p>
<p>Destinations can include:</p> <p>Flamborough Bird Observatory</p> <p>Filey Bird Observatory</p> <p>Spurn Bird Observatory and the Humber</p> <p>Top Hill Low</p> <p>Scarborough Harbour</p> <p>Hornsea Mere</p>	<p>Based at Highfield Farm, this 2.5-day tour focuses on the wonderful diversity of bird species in East and North Yorkshire.</p> <p>Winter in East and North Yorkshire is a great time for wildfowl and waders. The Humber estuary is teeming with hundreds of thousands of wading birds from Knot to Bar-tailed Godwit this is a great place to learn about how to identify and photograph these beautiful birds.</p> <p>Highfield Farm is ideally placed as a base to explore great winter sites such as Top Hill Low and Hornsea Mere which is Yorkshires largest freshwater lake and is one of the best places in our county for winter wildfowl from Slavonian Grebe to Goldeneye. White-winged Gulls are also often seen on the coast with Iceland Gull and Glaucous Gull regularly found.</p> <p>On the northern coasts there are great sites for Purple Sandpiper and Mediterranean Gull. Nearby in Scarborough Harbour waterbirds such as Red-throated Diver, Great Northern Diver, Black-throated Diver and Little Auks often shelter from the rough sea. This is also a great area for Kingfishers in the winter. Surprises often turn up; in 2015 up to 6 Black-necked Grebes were found and at Scalby Mills an American Wigeon. We will also be seeking out any Waxwings in the area during the time of the tour; these birds can provide fantastic photographic opportunities.</p>
